SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 09/07/2015 Officers responded to commercial burglary in the 8600 block of Wilshire Blvd. A suspect broke a window and stole a large bottle of alcohol. A short time later the suspect was located, identified by a witness, and arrested.
- 09/08/2015 Officers received an Automated License Plate Reader notification of a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was located and stopped in the 800 Block of Alpine Drive. The driver was subsequently arrested without incident.
- 09/11/2015 Officers received an Automated License Plate Reader notification of a stolen vehicle in the area of Wilshire and Santa Monica Blvd. The vehicle was located and the driver was arrested without incident.
- 09/12/2015 Officers responded to a noise complaint in the 200 Block of Spalding Drive. At the location, the suspect was uncooperative. After a brief investigation, officers decided to force open the door and located a female in distress. The suspect was subsequently arrested for attempted murder.

OFFICE OF THE CHIEF

- 10/15/2015 On September 28, 2015, the FBI released its "Crime in the United States, 2014" report. According to this report, Beverly Hills maintained its #1 position with the lowest amount of Part I Crime—and lowest amount of violent crime—in comparison with other Westside cities. Beverly Hills' rate was 3.2 violent crimes per 1,000 residents. Culver City, Santa Monica, and West Hollywood rated 4.3, 3.6, and 7.5 respectively.

DETECTIVE BUREAU

- 09/02/2015 Kenneth Tanner was identified through a fingerprint match and determined to be the individual responsible for the theft of a motor vehicle belonging to a resident of Beverly Hills. Based on the identification, a warrant was sought and obtained for his arrest. While actively searching for Tanner, it was learned he was wanted by LAPD for his involvement in car jacking. Working with LAPD, BHPD helped to facilitate Tanner's capture. Tanner has a pending court date for his crimes.
- 09/08/2015 Deandre Clemons was identified as the perpetrator responsible for an armed robbery in August of 2014 in Beverly Hills. Clemons immediately fled the state after committing the robbery, but was tracked to Reno, Nevada with the help of U.S. Marshals. After extraditing Clemons back to Southern California, Clemons was sentenced to six years in state prison on 9/08/15.
- 09/18/2015 A prolific ring of purse theft thieves targeted the Beverly Hills, Santa Monica, and West Los Angeles areas since early summer. Beverly Hills had in excess of twenty victims. The ring was believed to be comprised of as many as 10-15 male and females. Working with our regional partners, four suspects have been arrested. The arrests have led to Beverly Hills filing three criminal counts thus far. The investigation is ongoing and it is anticipated that more charges are forthcoming.
- 09/22/2015 Detective personnel received information regarding the theft of a painting belonging to a Beverly Hills resident valued at \$1,000,000. The painting was stolen by the resident's domestic housekeeper. It was also learned that there were arrangements to sell the painting to a buyer in Australia. Before the deal could be finalized, detectives were able to seize the painting, and freeze the bank account of the domestic before wiring his illegal gains out of the country.

TRAFFIC BUREAU

- 09/02/2015 Traffic Bureau supervisors met with Metro Purple Line representatives regarding the construction timeline and its impact on traffic flow on Wilshire Blvd between San Vicente and La Cienega Blvd. Motors were dedicated to the Metro Project on weekends to assist with the full closure of Wilshire Blvd between La Cienega and San Vicente Blvd.
- 09/16/2015 Traffic Bureau implemented a traffic plan and dedicated Traffic Bureau personnel to VPOTUS detail.
- 09/30/2015 After extensive investigation and follow-up, Traffic Investigators arrested two suspects involved in the 8/25 fatal hit and run on Crescent Drive.

09/30/2015 On-going - TCO's and Commercial Enforcement Officer continue to rove the Trousdale area to ensure compliance with the City Councils heavy hauling guidelines.

PERSONNEL & TRAINING BUREAU

10/01/2015 During the month of September, staff processed 109 entry-level and 8 lateral police applicants for the police officer position and 9 applicants for the police cadet position.
