SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 09/01/2014 At approximately 6PM, officers received an Automated License Plate Reader alert of a Felony Vehicle/Armed and Dangerous. The vehicle was stopped in the 300 Block of N. Beverly Dr and the suspect was arrested.
- 09/21/2014 At approximately 3AM, officers responded to a burglary in the 8500 Block of Wilshire Blvd. The suspect fled the scene and after a 3 1/2 hour search he was located and taken into custody.
- 09/25/2014 At approximately 1PM, an officer working Bike Patrol was flagged down by Chanel Security regarding 3 suspicious persons in the business district. After conducting an investigation, all three were arrested for Identity Theft and Forgery.

DETECTIVE BUREAU

- 09/10/2014 The Detective Bureau's High Tech Crimes Unit assisted DHS - Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) in the service of federal search warrants at numerous locations in Downtown Los Angeles. The search warrants resulted in the seizure, on-site processing, and analysis of numerous digital devices. Hundreds of millions of dollars in bulk US currency was also seized.
- 09/11/2014 Detective personnel arrested June Tapscott - Bazzi, a former employee of the Beverly Hills Unified School District. Tapscott - Bazzi was charged with grand theft for stealing approximately \$20,000 from the District during her time of employment.
- 09/18/2014 Detective Bureau personnel served three DNA search warrants on individuals believed to be responsible for residential and commercial burglaries in Beverly Hills. Pending positive results of the DNA samples, warrants will be sought for the individuals arrest from the District Attorney's Office.
- 09/18/2014 Detective personnel successfully completed an extradition of Devon Johnson from Pima, Arizona. Johnson confessed to detectives to being the shooter in a robbery and pistol whipping that occurred earlier this year in Beverly Hills.
- 09/22/2014 Detective Bureau personnel discovered two Rolex watches valued at \$484,000 had been stolen during an armed robbery at a mall in Escondido, CA, and delivered to two separate pawn brokers in the City. The delivery was discovered while reviewing pawn slips sent to the police department by the second hand dealers. This information was provided to Escondido PD, who recovered the stolen property.

TRAFFIC BUREAU

- 09/28/2014 Traffic Bureau coordinated street closures and implemented a traffic plan for the "Gran Fondo" bicycle event that started and ended in Beverly Hills.
- 09/30/2014 On-going Commercial Enforcement efforts continued throughout the month with numerous citations for a variety of violations.
- 09/30/2014 On-going - Traffic Control Officers and Commercial Enforcement Officer continue to rove the Trousdale area to ensure compliance with the City Councils heavy hauling guidelines.

PERSONNEL & TRAINING BUREAU

- 10/07/2014 During the month of September, staff processed 200 applicants for the police officer position. In addition, two Traffic Control Officers & one Communications Dispatcher were hired.
