PUBLIC NOTICE**

Santa Monica Boulevard Reconstruction Project

The City of Beverly Hills is developing plans to reconstruct North Santa Monica Boulevard. Prior to 2005 when the City assumed ownership, the State of California owned and maintained the Boulevard. The pavement quality and drainage systems have deteriorated to the extent that a complete reconstruction of the roadway is required.

As a first step in the planning process, the City Council appointed a 15-member *Santa Monica Boulevard Blue Ribbon Committee* to conduct public outreach and develop recommendations for possible elements to be incorporated into the design of the newly reconstructed roadway.

On March 4th, City Council will review the *Santa Monica Boulevard Blue Ribbon Committee* recommendations outlined below and provide direction on how to proceed with detailed project design.

- (1) Widen the existing curb-to-curb width to 66 feet to improve conditions for motor vehicles and bicycles. This requires a 3-foot widening beyond the existing northern curb face from Doheny Drive to Canon Drive and a 6-foot widening from Canon Drive to Walden Drive. If City Council approves the widening, the Blue Ribbon Committee recommends striping the pavement for bicycle lanes.
- (2) Add landscaped medians to the Boulevard.
