## **SIGNIFICANT EVENTS**

- 10/06/2015 Officers responded to an attempted residential burglary in the 600 Block of Trenton Drive. A short time later, officers located a suspect who matched the description. He was subsequently taken into custody without incident.
- 10/06/2015 Officers responded to the 800 block of North Crescent Drive after receiving a call of a male subject attempting to enter a home. The suspect had opened a sliding glass door and fled when confronted by the resident and her dog. Officers subsequently located the suspect and arrested him for residential burglary.
- 10/30/2105 Officers received an Automated License Plate Recognition notification of a stolen vehicle on Sunset Blvd at Hillcrest Road. The vehicle was located, stopped, and the driver arrested without incident.

## **DETECTIVE BUREAU**

- 10/21/2015 Detective Bureau personnel conducted a compliance check operation focusing on registered sex offenders residing in Beverly Hills. Of the individuals contacted, all were determined to be in compliance of current California sex registrant law.
- 10/21/2015 Detective Bureau personnel took part in a joint investigation involving law enforcement authorities within the Los Angeles basin, Houston, TX area and the FBI to take into custody a key suspect involved in a rash of virtual kidnappings that targeted families, including those residing in Beverly Hills. The investigation led to the arrest of Yanette Rodriguez Acosta of Houston, Texas.

## **TRAFFIC BUREAU**

- 10/14/2015 Traffic Bureau supervisors met with Metro Purple Line representatives regarding the construction timeline, construction related activities, and construction traffic plans on Wilshire Blvd between San Vicente and La Cienega Blvd. TCO's were dedicated to the Metro project on several occasions to assist with the flow of traffic during core drillings in the vicinity of Beverly Hills High School
- 10/17/2015 Traffic Control Officers implemented a traffic plan for the Beverly Hills Art Show.
- 10/22/2015 Traffic Investigators testified in the preliminary hearing for 187 Penal Code fatal hit-and-run suspect Sue Sohn. Sohn was held to answer.
- 10/31/2015 On-going TCO's & Commercial Enforcement Officer continue to rove the Trousdale area to ensure compliance with the City Councils heavy hauling guidelines.

## **PERSONNEL & TRAINING BUREAU**

- 11/12/2015 During the month of October, staff processed 104 entry-level and 12 lateral police applicants for the police officer position and 4 applicants for the police cadet position. In addition, 1 Traffic Control Officer was hired.
