Beverly Hills Police Department has been actively seeking the public's assistance in locating two prolific residential burglary suspects. In this continuing effort pertaining to a lengthy investigation into the Rolling 30's Harlem Crips, Beverly Hills Police have focused on the gang's daytime residential burglary crime spree that has plagued all of Los Angeles County.

On February 7, 2011, BHPD surveillance units observed Germaine Jackson, Tyree Jackson and Bryan Rachal commit a brazen daytime residential burglary on a busy street in North Hollywood. The three used a common method of operation: knocking on the front door of the residence, if there is no answer, two of the subjects enter the residence and ransack the home looking for jewelry, money and guns.

After the commission of this specific crime, BHPD units immediately initiated a traffic stop on the car that was waiting for the suspects outside the victim's home. Even though all three suspects fled from the vehicle, Germaine Jackson was located a few hours later and arrested. Tyree Jackson and Bryan Rachal were able to avoid apprehension.

Arrest warrants were issued for Tyree Jackson and Bryan Rachal. Bryan Rachal is on parole with the California Department of Corrections which has now issued a Parolee at Large warrant for Rachal.

On the morning of April 8, 2011 Beverly Hills Police had Tyree Jackson under "rolling" vehicle surveillance. Once Tyree exited his vehicle at a convenience store in the area of 115th St and S. Vermont Ave, officers took the opportunity to attempt to safely place him into custody. Tyree ran from the officers who gave chase and apprehended him without further incident. No officers were injured during the chase or arrest; Tyree suffered only very minor injuries.

"This is another example of the commitment, perseverance, and all around fine police work of our officers. These officers are to be commended for their part in creating a near perfect scenario which allowed them to take this dangerous felony suspect off the streets, without risking the safety of the community." - Chief Dave Snowden

NOTE: Bryan Rachal is still outstanding. He is 25 years old and is 5'06 130lbs.
